Frequently Asked Questions

1. When is the filing deadline for 2023 personal income tax returns?

Answer: Monday, April 15, 2024

2. Does my dependent child have to file a Tax Return?

Answer: A dependent must file an income tax return if their 2023 gross income is more than \$13,850 of earned income or \$1,150 of unearned income.

3. Can I deduct my medical expenses?

Answer: Out-of-pocket medical expenses that are not reimbursed by insurance are deductible as an itemized deduction to the extent they exceed 7.5% of the taxpayer's adjusted gross income.

Eligible medical expenses are those paid for:

- The diagnosis, cure, mitigation, treatment, or prevention of disease, or for the purpose of affecting any structure or function of the body;
- Transportation primarily for and essential to medical care;
- Qualified long-term care services; or
- Insurance
- Taxpayers who travel abroad for medical services may be able to deduct
 the expenses if the medical care is provided by a doctor in a licensed
 hospital or in a medical care facility related to, or the equivalent of, a
 licensed hospital.

Medicine and drugs are only classified as eligible medical expenses if they are prescribed by a doctor or are insulin.

- 4. Do I have to file a return if I made less than \$600 in a gig related activity (Uber)? **Answer:** Taxpayers are subject to the self-employment tax if their net earnings from self-employment are \$400 or greater.
- 5. I bought an electric vehicle, does my vehicle qualify for the Clean Vehicle Credit? Answer: The federal government maintains a website with a list of all vehicles eligible for all three of the clean vehicle credits at: https://fueleconomy.gov/feg/taxcenter.shtml
